- Official transcripts
- Motivation form
- Short CV (max. 2 pages)
- Proof of English language proficiency Not required if you have
 - a BA from an accredited Dutch academic university
 - a BA from a university in the USA, Canada, the UK, Ireland, Australia or New Zealand
 - an International Baccalaureate diploma taught in English
